2.	Why does Paul encourage forgiving other people, especially those within the church? (v. 7-8)
3.	What does this passage teach us about the nature of church discipline (see Matt 18:15-20 for more insights)?
4.	Paul turns down an opportunity for ministry that the Lord has "opened" (2:12); when is it right to turn down opportunities for ministry?
5.	Until Titus returns with "good news" (see 2 Cor 7:6-13), Paul has "no peace of mind" (2:13). What does that say about Paul's concern for the church?
6.	How can the same gospel be either the smell of death or the fragrance of life (2:15-16)?
7.	How can you spread the "aroma of Christ" in your home? In your place of work?
8.	Who is someone you can verbally point to Jesus this week?
